COVID-19 Status Report

The memo is a weekly status report presented Wednesdays and provides a brief summary of information regarding Village of Oak Park operational activities in response to COVID-19.

New COVID-19 Cases

The Village of Oak Park Department of Public Health received official notification of 57 COVID-19 cases from March 23-30, 2022. This is a 3.4% decrease over the last 7-day period, and a 44.6% decrease over the cases 30 days ago.

COVID-19 Community Transmission Rates

Based on the positives cases reported to the Village of Oak Park, for the week of March 23-30, our weekly COVID-19 rate of 105 cases per 100,000 places us in high community transmission. The CDC recommends tracking community transmission rates and using this to set control measures for hospitals and congregate living facilities.

These numbers do not reflect those who tested positive using at home self-administered test. At-home test must be confirmed at an official testing site (pharmacy, physician office, health department, school, etc.) so that information can be transferred to the health department.

COVID-19 Community Levels

On February 25, 2022, the CDC introduced COVID-19 Community Levels of low, medium, and high. Oak Park is in the low level, as defined by less than 200 cases per 100,000 (we have 105 per 100,000), and less than 10% of staffed inpatient beds occupied by COVID-19 patients (we have 3.5% of our hospital beds occupied by COVID-19 patients). We currently track our COVID admissions as cumulative totals, and the CDC definition requires new cases per 7 days. We will continue to adapt our data to align with CDC definitions so we can track and report on this metric.

Deaths

There were 0 reported deaths to residents from COVID-19 in the community for this time period.

Oak Park Residents Vaccinated

Oak Park reports 88.1% of residents receiving their first dose and 80.5% completing their primary vaccination series. The CDC is recommending a fourth dose for people age 50 and above. The Oak Park Department of Public Health will be hosting booster clinics the week of April 4th. Check the Village of Oak Park website for up-to-date clinic information and to register.
