COVID-19 Status Report Oak Park Village Board of Trustees

To: Village President and Village Board of Trustees

The memo is a weekly status report presented Wednesdays and provides a brief summary of information regarding Village of Oak Park operational activities in response to COVID-19.

The Oak Park Health Department is working with the Village Manager's office on ideas to change the report for the 2022 calendar year. Data elements and formatting are subject to change until new reporting structure is finalized.

### **New COVID-19 Cases**

The Village of Oak Park Department of Public Health received official notification of 235 COVID-19 cases from January 26, 2022 to February 1, 2022. This is a 52.4% decrease over the last 7-day period, and a 64.3% decrease over the cases 30 days ago.

## **COVID-19 Community Transmission Rates**

Based on the positives cases reported to the Village of Oak Park, for the week of January 26-February 1, our weekly COVID-19 rate of 431 cases per 100,000 placed us in high community transmission range.

These numbers do not reflect those who tested positive using at home self-administered test. Athome test must be confirmed at an official testing site (pharmacy, physician office, health department, school, etc.) so that information can be transferred to the health department. Official test results are used to track the amount of virus in the community and release people who test positive from isolation. The health department cannot provide any resident with a release from isolation without an official notification of their COVID-19 positive status.

## **Test Positivity Rates**

The test positivity rate for Oak Park as of February 1 is 2.87%, representing an 47.6% decrease from the previous week. The test positivity rate for the region was 6.7% on January 29, representing a 48.5% decrease from the previous week.

Illinois considers a positivity rate below 5% as low. The test positivity rate is impacted by address/zip code given at time of testing and could be undercounted as a result of the high amount of missing data.

# **ICU Hospitalizations**

Oak Park residents utilize hospitals across our region. The state reports 15% ICU hospital bed availability at this time; anything under 20% of ICU hospital bed availability places a region in "warning" level.

### **Deaths**

Oak Park Health Department Director Dr. Theresa Chapple is sad to inform the community of 6 additional deaths to residents from COVID-19 that occurred during the surge from November 20 through January 22, bringing total resident deaths to 13 during this time period.

The six resident deaths ranged in age from 61 to 87—two we were in their 60s, two were in their 70s, and two were in their 80s. Dr. Chapple extends her sincerest condolences to their families.

#### Oak Park Residents Vaccinated

At the time of this report at 4:00 pm on February 2, IDPH had not yet updated vaccination data on their website.

The most recent vaccination data as of January 26 is 87% of Oak Park residents received their first dose and 79% completed their primary vaccination series.

## **Age Range Data**

Oak Park residents who tested positive for COVID-19 ranged in age from infancy to 87 years.
