**COVID-19 Status Report
Oak Park Village Board of Trustees**

To: Village President and Village Board of Trustees

The memo is a means to share a brief summary of information regarding Village of Oak Park operational activities in response to COVID-19. In most cases, formal public guidance or employee guidance has been publicly disseminated via the Village website or Village social media channels.

The issuance of the Status Reports will be increased to Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays in response to the slight uptick during this past seven day period.

New Public Health Guidance

The Village of Oak Park Department of Public Health received notification of the following new COVID-19 cases; since last reported on Monday July 27:

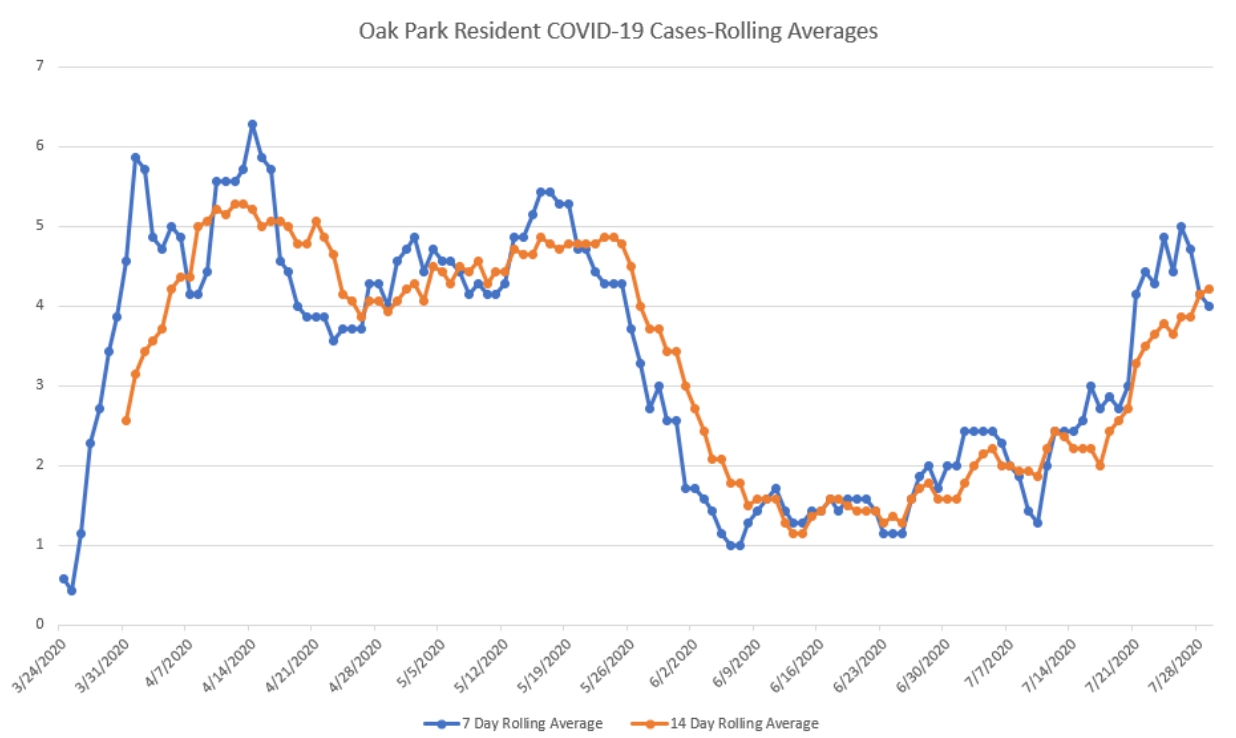
Excluding individuals for which street addresses are not yet determined, the State of Illinois reports a total of four-hundred and thirty-seven (437) total Oak Park COVID-19 cases. It is important to note that as patient tracking and case follow-up occurs, individuals listed within the number of Oak Park cases reported may change depending on residency confirmation.

Also, Oak Park Public Health Director Mike Charley reported today that a case originally reported on 07/24 was found to be a Chicago resident so the case was transferred to Chicago, and removed from Oak Park’s numbers.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is notified of positive tests as established by state and local public health protocol. Because of privacy laws, no additional information can be released about the individuals. It is noted, that privacy precludes location information regarding individuals tested to anyone other than Public Health Officials and First Responders.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is working closely with officials from the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), investigating and notifying anyone who may have had exposure to the individual who tested positive for COVID-19. Local public health officials, hospitals and first responders are following protocols consistent with the latest guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Public Health Director Charley has also provided an update to the 14 day rolling average and is also including a 7 day rolling average for Oak Park.



- Rolling Averages: I have included both the 7 day and 14 day rolling averages for Oak Park & State of Illinois within the below charts.
 - Oak Park rolling averages as of today:
 - 7 day: 4.0
 - 14 day: 4.2
 - State of Illinois rolling averages as of today:
 - 7 day: 1276
 - 14 day: 1231

The lowest 14 day rolling average in Oak Park to date was on June 14, 2020 with 1.14 cases/day. The lowest for the State of Illinois was on June 23, 2020 of 615 cases/day.

Cases related to Long-Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities

Public Health Director Charley reported a staff person at Brookdale has tested positive. The chart below is now updated to show that additional case (*).

New Emergency Declaration in Oak Park

On Monday, July 27, 2020, the Village Board approved a resolution *Declaring an Emergency affecting Public Health*. This is similar to the initial emergency declarations approved by the Village Board in March and April of this year. This is NOT a stay home order.

The adoption of this Declaration will support staff's continued focus our public health efforts to ensure that residents and visitors to Oak Park are making informed decisions about personal and family gatherings, travel, use of face coverings and the activities they choose to participate in. The novel coronavirus disease is rapidly changing and we want to ensure Oak Park does not experience continued increase in cases that could trigger that State of Illinois instituting mitigations steps in our region.
