DISTINCT BUT CONNECTED

Each of the three concepts is distinct, not only in its physical manifestation, but in the sources of inspiration from which it draws and the big ideas it represents. But as distinct as they are, they share a vocabulary that was established in earlier phases of work.

They are alive to the new reality of Oak Park — that the diversity of its residents and visitors requires a multi-layered approach to messaging, a program that moves simultaneously at multiple speeds.

Elegant, minimal, and crafted with care, this scheme emphasizes formal simplicity.



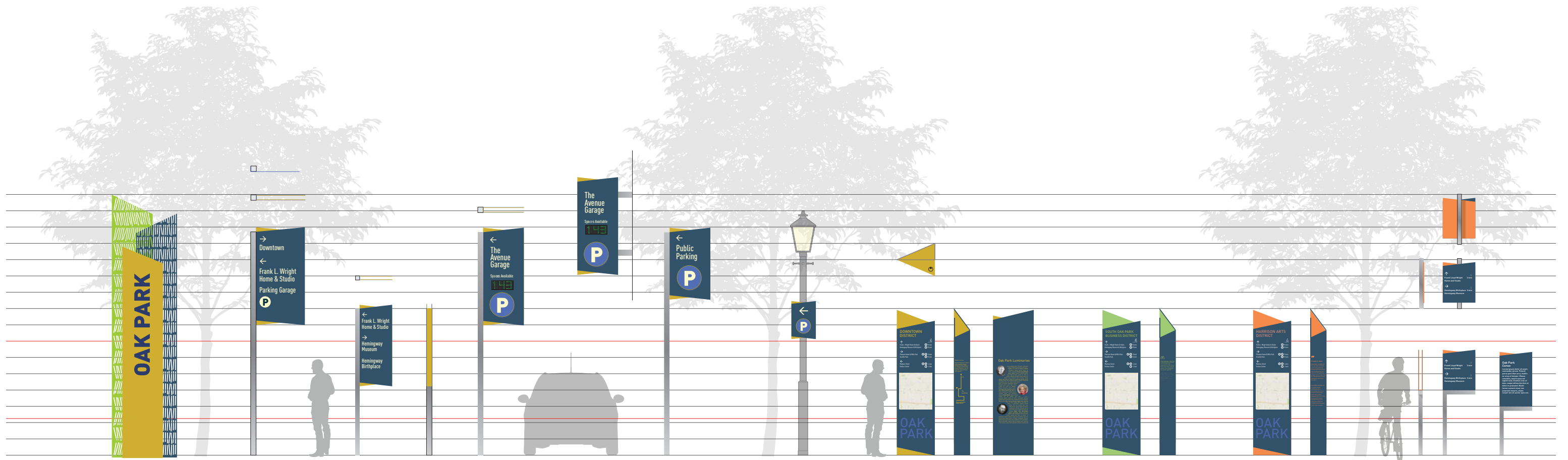
- “Strong, simple.”

Taking inspiration from a flat prairie landscape, punctuated with tall blades, this scheme focuses on organic forms, pronounced voids, and light.



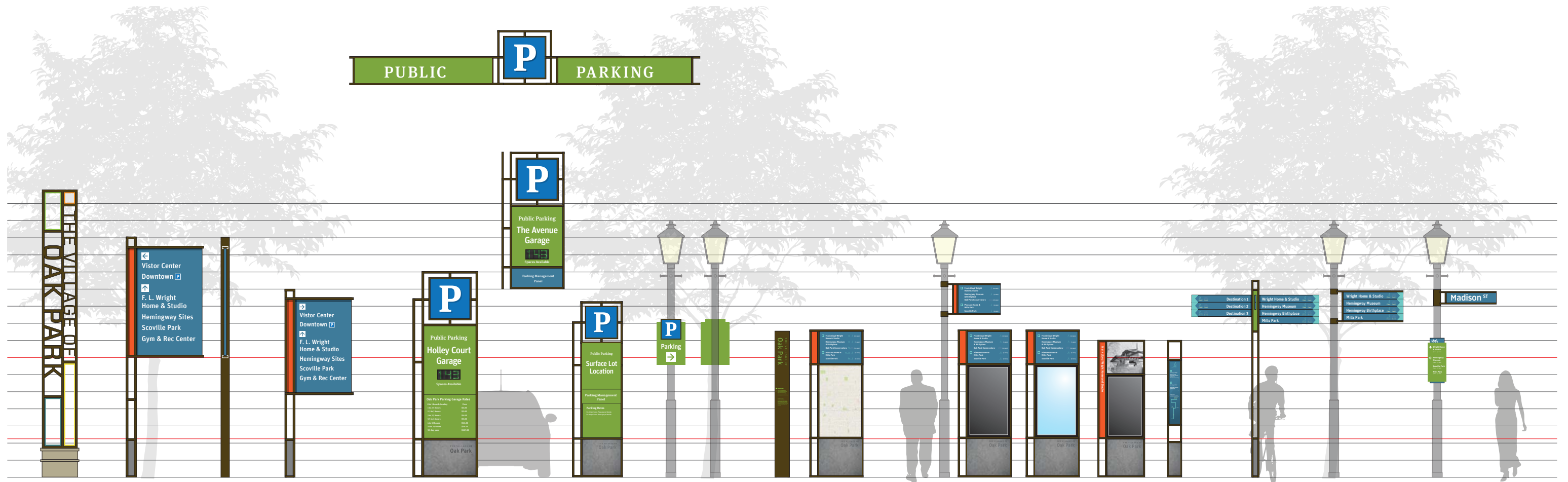

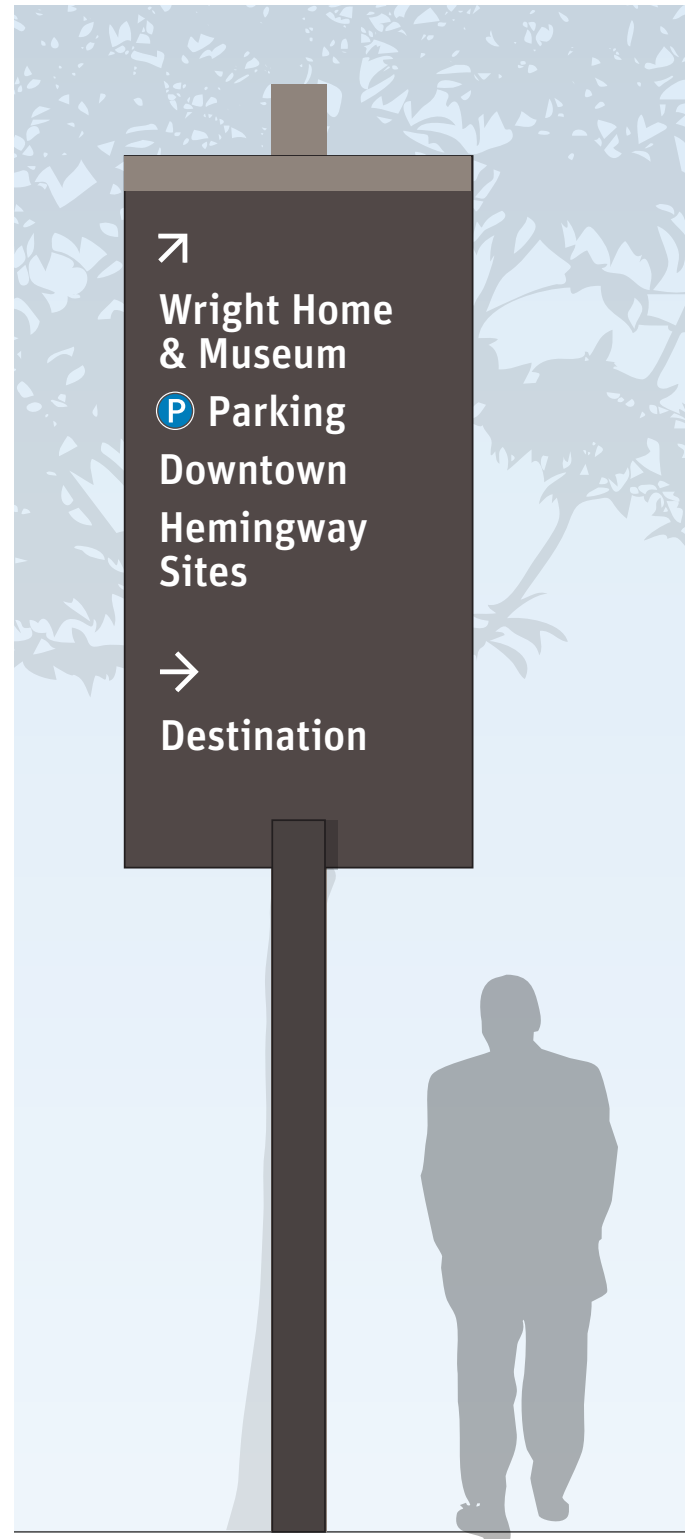

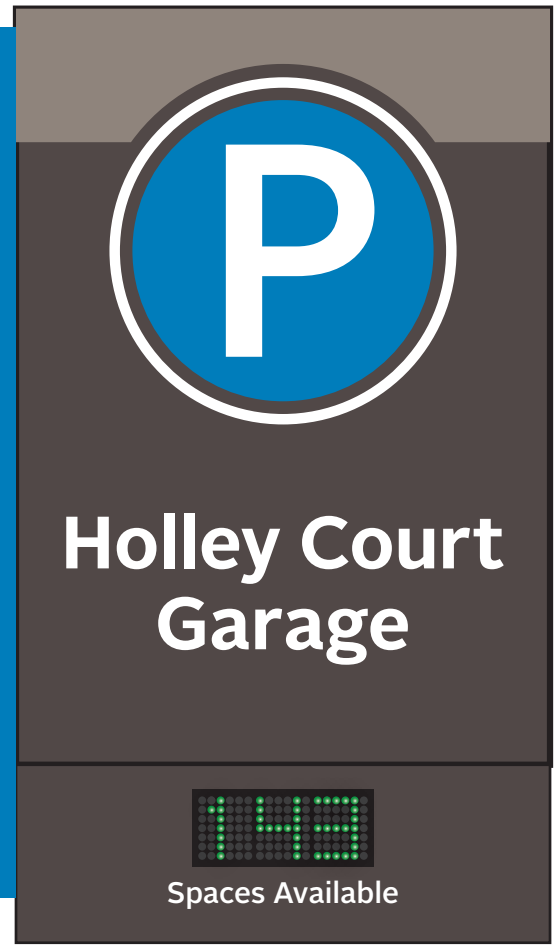
