**COVID-19 Status Report  
Oak Park Village Board of Trustees**

To: Village President and Village Board of Trustees

The memo is a means to share a brief summary of information regarding Village of Oak Park operational activities in response to COVID-19. In most cases, formal public guidance or employee guidance has been publicly disseminated via the Village website or Village social media channels.

**New Public Health Guidance**

Today, the Village of Oak Park Department of Public Health received notification of the following new COVID-19 cases:

Excluding individuals for which street addresses are not yet determined, the State of Illinois reports a total of two thousand seven hundred and nineteen (2719) Oak Park COVID-19 cases. It is important to note that as patient tracking and case follow-up occurs, individuals listing the number of Oak Park cases reported may change depending on residency confirmation.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is notified of positive tests as established by state and local public health protocol. Because of privacy laws, no additional information can be released about the individuals. It is noted, that privacy precludes location information regarding individuals tested to anyone other than Public Health Officials and First Responders.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is working closely with officials from the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), investigating and notifying anyone who may have had exposure to the individual who tested positive for COVID-19. Local public health officials, hospitals and first responders are following protocols consistent with the latest guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

**Vaccinations**

During the past two Saturdays, more than 1,000 vaccinations were made available to eligible educators at School District 97 and School District 200. As a part of these events, extra doses were made available to Oak Park licensed daycare employees and residents who work in K-12 schools outside of Oak Park. In addition, local residents assisted in connecting several Oak Park's

senior who were not digitally connected to receiving a vaccine as a small number of extra doses were available this past Saturday. While the Village continues to focus on completing second dose vaccines over the next two weeks for all seniors in congregate living sites, all other vaccine capacity is focused on scheduling residents over 78, educators, daycare workers and other essential workers and a proportionate basis for the next several weeks.

**Public Health Data**

Interim Public Health Director Terry has shared the following data related to COVID-19.

“New cases per 100,000 People”. This metric looks at the number of recent COVID-19 cases per 100,000 people to describe the potential number of people who are currently ill and may be infectious. This is the number of new cases reported by IDPH in the previous week. Calculated as a rate = [Village of Oak Park case count for 7 days] / [Village population] x100,000.

- Oak Park rate: 80/100,000
- Cook County rate: 109/100,000 (2/7/2021 through 2/13/2021)
- Target for County-level data: Cases for the week are fewer than 10 or the rate is fewer than 50 cases per 100,000 people
- Warning for County-level data: New case rate is greater than 50 cases per 100,000 people

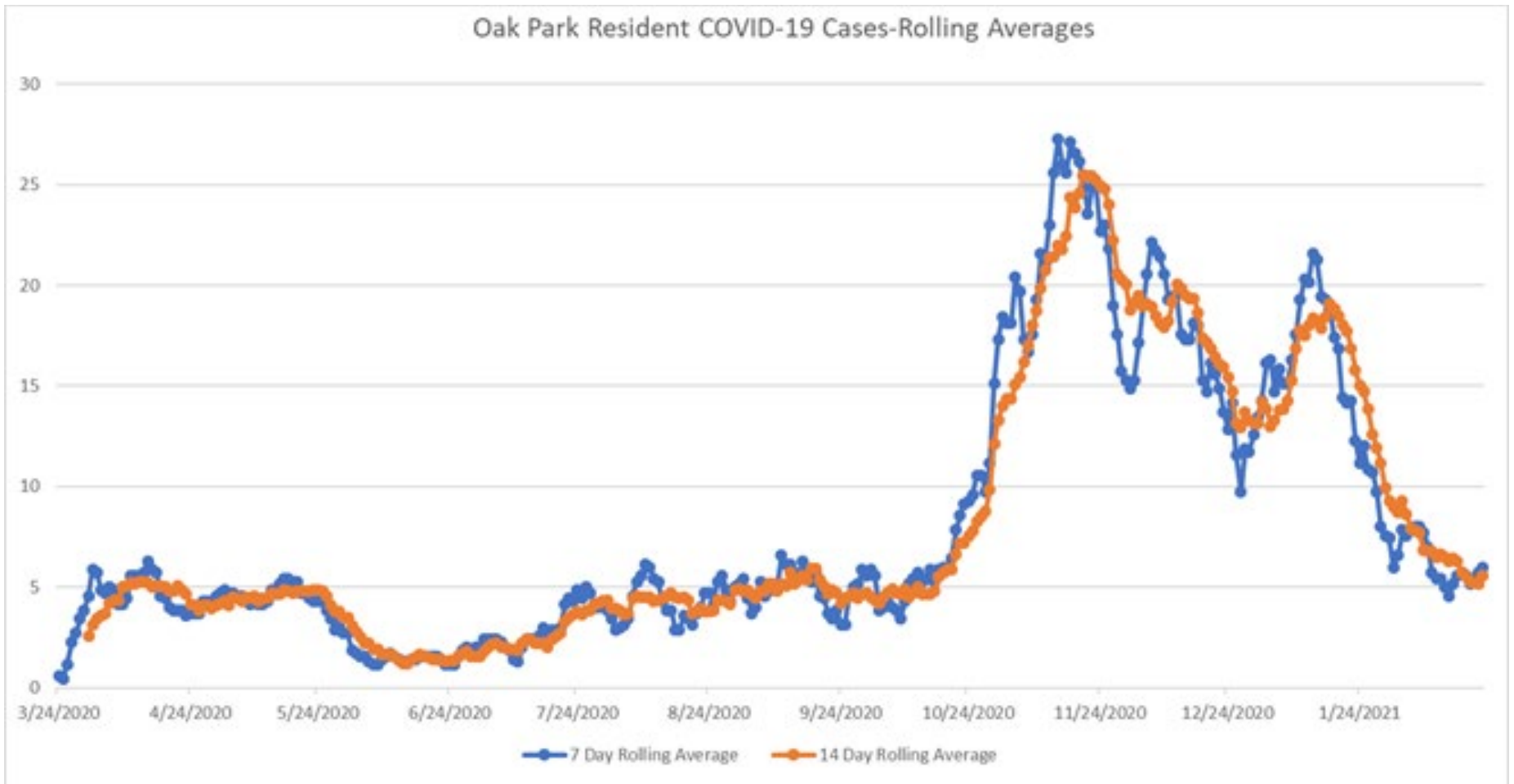

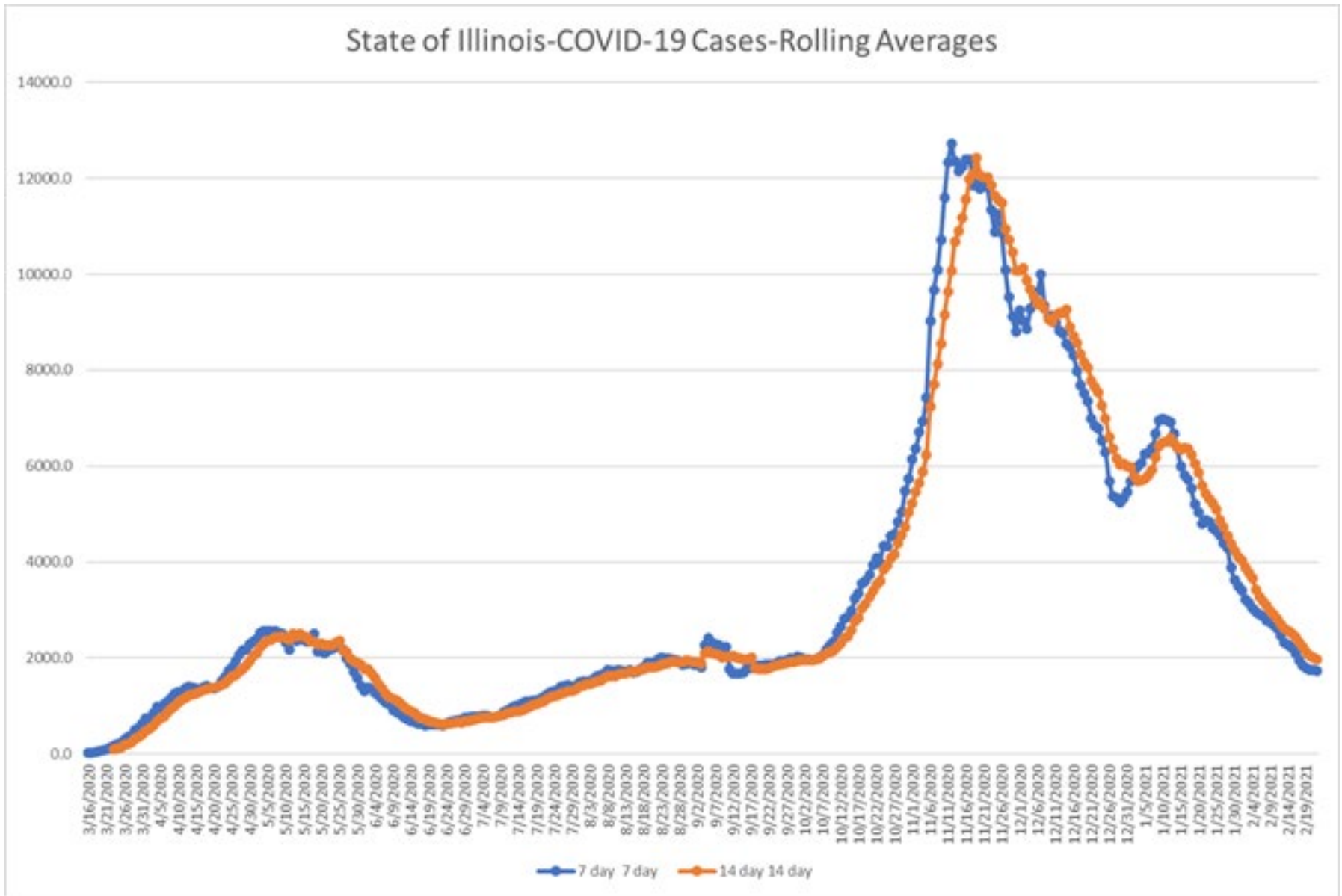
