OVERVIEW

- Oak Park Public Health Department is Mass Vaccinating residents AND institutional workforce for COVID-19
- Mass Vaccination dependent upon Supply of Vaccine allocated to the Oak Park Health Department by the State
- Currently Vaccinating 1a Only
- We cannot state affirmative today when 1b vaccinations will start – this is due to supply of vaccine

PUBLIC HEALTH VACCINATIONS

- Work within State, CDC and Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) guidance – which is evolving
- Administer efficiently and equitably vaccine received to the public in a manner which balances the goals of reducing deaths from COVID-19 and Societal Functioning
- Prioritize vaccination providers/settings to increase public/private partnership of who will administer COVID-19 vaccine to the community

CURRENT PROGRESS AND ASSUMPTIONS

VACCINE ALLOCATION TO LOCAL DEPARTMENTS OF PUBLIC HEALTH

- In August 2020, work related to Mass Vaccinations began – it is supported by the entire organization.
- Since the first vaccines were delivered in Oak Park on December 17, 2020 through January 12, 2021, the Public Health Department has received a total of 3,535 first doses of vaccine. – which averages less than 600 doses per week. 94% has been allocated.
- Vaccine received has been allocated to Rush Oak Park Hospital, West Suburban Medical Center, PCC Wellness (FQHC) for administration to their institutions health care workers and additional Ia eligible health care workers. Rush OP is also partnering for eligible non-affiliated Ia.
- The Public Health Department has also vaccinated additional Ia eligible health care workers who are residents or work at Oak Park facilities.

OAK PARK SENIOR CONGREGATE LIVING DEMOGRAPHICS

- State and Federal Partnerships are vaccinating Long Term Care facilities – not Local Public Health Departments
- Access to this State and Federal Partnership has not been available to all Oak Park facilities
- Public Health is working to address staff at facilities which do not qualify and will also vaccinate residents under 1b

(630+ are in Long Term Care – some will be vaccinated under Federal/State program and approx. 540 resident income qualified Senior Housing)

1b in OAK PARK – ESSENTIAL WORKERS

It is estimated that another 7,500 – 10,000 individuals could be classified essential workers under 1b (with 5,200 in education/licensed daycare alone)

- COVID-19 mortality rates are highest in older adults

SUMMARY

- Oak Park remains in Phase 1a – Health Care Eligible Workers.
- Through January 12, there have been 3,535 first doses of vaccine received and allocated to Oak Park hospitals to vaccinate their workers AND the Public Health Department has administered vaccine to non-affiliated workers. We have only 200 doses on hand that are being administered this week.
- Estimated maximum demand in Oak Park for 1a could be more than 9,000
- Estimated maximum demand in Oak Park for 1b could be more than 12,000.
- Public Health will announce when we have vaccine supply to start 1b – we are not keeping a waiting list.
- The top priority in 1b will be seniors in congregate living facilities not being vaccinated by Federal/State partnerships and those seniors in income eligible apartments.
- We will determine subsequent priorities in the coming weeks.

NEXT STEPS

- Flexibility. Within national guidelines, state and local jurisdictions have flexibility to administer vaccine based on local epidemiology
- Patience from everyone is essential. Supply is needed to continue to move forward.
- Private Partnerships will be used when supply allows.
