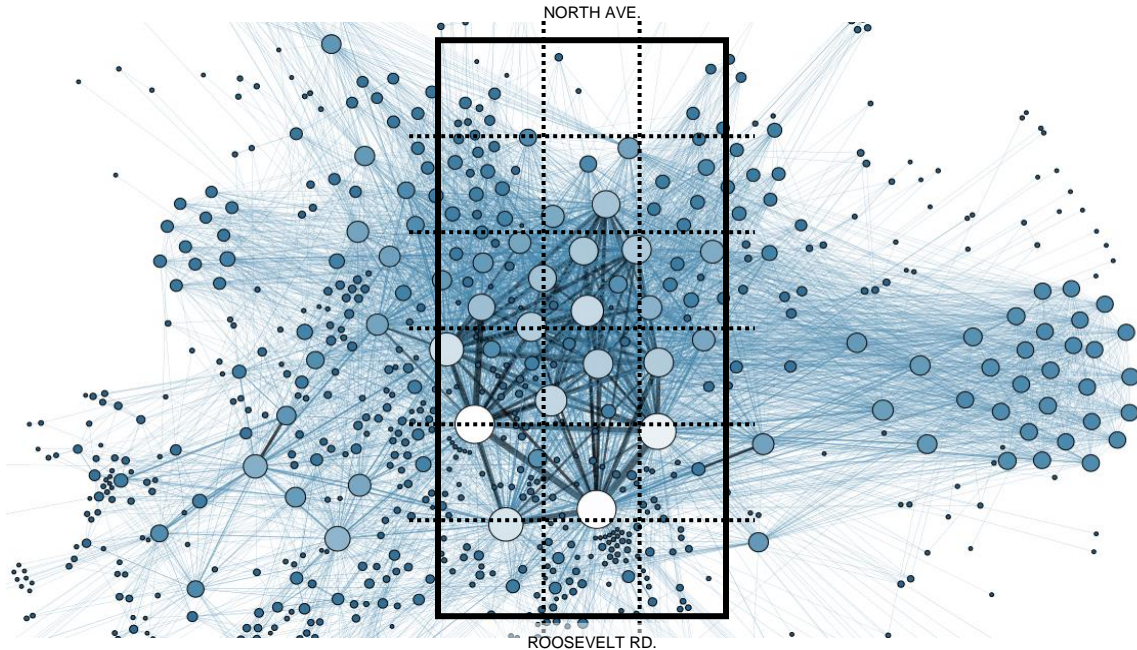


GREEN TUESDAYS IN THE VILLAGE
